

ECDC NEWS

What a hot week for our children and staff here at Immanuel. Many of the rooms chose to do water play outside and focus on that theme this week. Our infant room studied Pirates and Mermaids this week. Their clever lead teacher Erin put together a play list about pirates and mermaids for the littlest ones to listen to during the day. They learned the baby sign language sign for "Friends" and taught that to the children. They painted pirate hats, made a triangle black with finger paint and used their magic paint dots to make colors on a paper mermaid's tail. Their sensory bin activity was touching pom pom balls with beaded necklaces hidden under the pom poms, very creative teachers! Their Bible story was "God is in Charge of Everything" with Ginny the Giraffe puppet helping to tell the story.

Our toddlers continued on with their water study by talking about the uses for water. They made bubbles in dish water and their sensory table, they also blew bubbles outside watching the wind catch them and float away. They played with ice cubes in their indoor sensory table, feeling how cold they were and how they eventually melted back into the form of water. They created shark heads out of paper plates and made watermelon slices for their bulletin board, putting the seeds in with paint dots. Their Bible story was "Jesus Came to Save Sinners" with Marvin the monkey puppet helping to tell that story.

Our Primary Room was busy this week with watermelons as well creating watermelon pictures with paint and paper. They also spent a lot of time outside enjoying the splash pad and sprinklers. With all the hot weather they spent as much time getting wet and trying to stay cool. Their special activity this week was making their own pizzas and the Pizza Hut in town! They walked down to Pizza Hut and were able to use the ingredients at Pizza Hut to make their own personal pizza. That is so great that they were able to see how pizzas were made! Well done teachers for your ingenuity in getting the restaurant to help the children learn! One of the children's mother is a police officer and she came in to give the children a talk on bicycle safety. The children then went out to practice the safety they were just taught. Thank you to Holly Higgs for helping the children to be more safe on their bicycles.

Our school age room was very challenged this week, they had to move to the preschool room in the new part of the school to avoid the loud bangs and equipment noise being made by the roofers working above their heads. They were able to pay attention to their "P's" and "Q's" by making fruit pizza, making their own pizzas at Pizza Hut, making pom pom shooters, playing on their splash pad, hanging out in the preschool room playing games, doing puzzles and trying to stay busy inside out of the very hot, humid weather.

New Worship Service Times Don't forget, we have changed our Sunday worship times to 8:30 am for traditional worship and 10:45 for Praise Worship. In addition, we have added a Midweek Family Worship on Wednesday evenings at 6:00 pm; this week the service will take place in room #6. The pattern of informal, casual, worship. The theme for the sermon will be the same as the theme provided the Sunday before; however, the liturgy will be very simple like unto a family devotion, or a devotion shared at Family Camp (45-50 minutes). The message will be offered in brief segments. In between each segment will be a Gospel Activity. There will be one Praise Song at the beginning and one Praise Song at the end of each Family Worship service (recorded music will be used). The dress code is come-as-you-are.
