

Our school age and primary rooms enjoyed a lot of outdoor time this week with the very lovely weather as the teachers prepare for our preschool start this year after Labor Day. With the author of this newsletter away from the office most of this week the activities noted in this edition are from last week. The school age room and primary rooms enjoyed a movie this week to go and see the movie Bad Guys 2. "The Bad Guys 2" is a benignly rambunctious cartoon about a quintet of critters — the debonair Mr. Wolf, the goofy/bad guy Mr. Snake, the flatulent Mr. Piranha, the disguise expert Mr. Shark, and the brainiac Ms. Tarantula — who are famous for being bad guys (they're known as "the Bad Guys"), but when you come right down to it they're actually pretty good guys. 




