Thanksgiving preparations are in full swing, all the students are preparing for our Thanksgiving Feast for the students and their families this coming Tuesday. The children make the decorations for the tables and show how much they have learned this year so far. Their cutting skills and glueing skills as well as their printing and letters for their names and messages to their family. This is such a wonderful time of sharing and love right before they go on to their Thanksgiving Day with their family.

Our active fours had an exciting week because they received visits from our community helpers (first responders). Bridgman City Police and Fire departments along with their K-9 division joined in the celebration with their vehicles and uniforms, allowing the students to sit in their fire engines and police cars. Berrien County Sheriff and Michigan State Police came as well to help the children see how many people are around them to protect them. Their Bible story this week was "The Road to Bethlehem".

Our threes worked on turkeys, creating all different kinds of turkeys with scissors, glue, feathers and crayons. They studied the letter "O" by making a very dark Owl. Their Bible story was "A Wife for Isaac"

Our GSRP room was very busy with conferences with their parents and teachers. They did manage to make Turkey headbands, completed their Tree Study by reviewing what they learned about trees and studied the letters "Q" and "C".

Our Toddler room was very busy with preparing for the Thanksgiving Feast next week. They made placemats, colored their own Thanksgiving Day Turkey, made playdough and their own animal creations, They made sugar cookies and shared them with the teachers in the other rooms and they made pumpkin pie slices that they were able to share with their families. They were able to visit with the firemen outside on a walk, when they came to visit the Skill Builder classroom. They enjoyed sitting in the fire trucks. They made "apple Donuts" with apple rings and icing, really yummy! Their Bible story was the Ten Lepers and One Gave Thanks.

Our Infant Room learned about Thanksgiving this week and will work on that theme next week. They made footprint pumpkin pie slices for their parent keepsake. Their shape was a moon where they colored the moon in orange. They read about Thanksgiving with the teachers reading to the infants about the first Thanksgiving and why we should give thanks to our God for all the blessings He has given us. Their Baby Sign Language word was "Sun" and their Bible story was "Jesus Came to Save Sinners" with Toby the Tiger helping to tell the story to the infants.


All of the preschool classrooms are also working hard on the Children's Christmas program "The Legend of the Candy Cane", learning their lines and where to stand for the performance.






