PRESCHOOL HAS BEGUN! Another school year has begun, and our students are all excited to start their educational journey with our preschool teachers leading them towards the beginning of learning the basics and their relationship with the Lord,

Stevie Hill is heading up our Skill Builders classroom this year and has created a wonderful learning area for her students. She has quite the challenge this year with a class of mostly very active boys. Please keep her in your prayers as well as her assistant teachers, Emily and one helper yet to be chosen. They all enjoyed an open house with students and their parents, getting to know each other and the rules of the room.

They got to know the schedule they would follow in the classroom, starting to recognize and write their names as well as sing the ABC song, their color this week was red, their letter they were learning about the letter "C" and the number "0". They started their journey by listening to the Bible story of how God created the world. Such a busy time and one that requires much patience for teachers and students alike.

Our Early Learners classroom concentrated on new relationships in their room with the addition of new students from the toddler room. They read the book Kissing the Hand with Chester the Racoon. It's a story about how a mother racoon gave her little son Chester a comforting kiss in his hand to carry her with him as he ventured from home for the very first time. This book helped the children to know that a kiss given to them by a parent will carry them to uncomfortable situations away from home. Most of the children have not had a classroom experience and this was a very valuable lesson for the young students. They also made a racoon out of their handprints and paper plates, very creative of our teachers! The students worked on the upper case and lower case letter "A" and created a paper apple to show off their knowledge.

Our Great Start to Readiness Program had their open house on Friday and the families and students got to know each other. Pastor Krengel was on hand to greet the families and wish them well on the start of their educational journey. We have two new teachers in the GSRP room this year, Ms Sara and Ms Tanya we welcome them to our ECDC staff and pray that they are able to reach the children and share their knowledge with them.

Our Toddler Room enjoyed a week of "All About Me". They made handprints that showed how unique each print was. They created a self portrait using crayons to color their eyes and hair. Their creative teachers developed a flower growth chart marking the height of the children with some beautiful paper flowers. They also played with popcorn kernels in their sensory table, great fun!

Our Infant Room also had a week where they explored "All About Me", by singing songs like "Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes" they read the Bible story "God Wants Us to Pray" with Marvin the Monkey helping to tell the story, they used dabbing markers to color their smiley faces too. Their Baby Sign Language this week was the word "Sorry". They made keep sake handprints for their families too and their shape this week was a diamond and their color was yellow. We are so grateful to our teachers and their loving creative souls!






