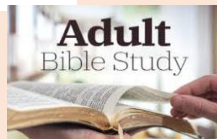
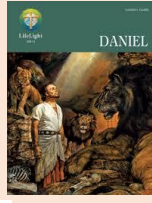
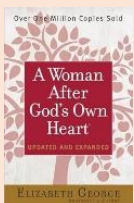

ECDC NEWS

Everyone is back and getting to know the rules of the room again and getting along with fellow students and their teachers. Two weeks is a long time in the life of a preschooler. Our four-year-olds have been busy reviewing the weeks before they left for Christmas break. Their teacher Ms. Stevie did a great job teaching them, they remembered their lessons! They were introduced to a study called "Let's Investigate", where the children are given tools and clues to solve a mystery, with the help of magnifying glasses, scales and tweezers to uncover the clues. They studied the letter "P" upper and lower case, the color green, the star shapes the number 9. Their Bible story was "The Wise Men Found Jesus". They also followed a recipe to make their own slime. Their art project involved finger painting star shapes. Well done! Our three-year-olds have been busy making snowmen, discussing winter, (even though it was very unseasonal this week) and creating a parrot out of the letter "P". Their Bible story was about the Wise Men, appropriate for the season of Epiphany. They worked very hard this week on relearning the rules of the classroom, listening to their teachers and respecting their fellow students. Our teachers are especially equipped with extra patience and love to be able to keep reeducating our young students. Thank you, teachers, for all that you do! Our GSRP room started a new learning series about music, our talented teacher Ms. Heather is a musician herself and will be able to get these students special equipment to experiment with for this series. Their teachers built a music booth with a turntable so the children can see how music is developed. They worked on new letters this week T, M, H, L, learning to recognize each letter and the sound each one makes. Officer Higgs from the Michigan State Police made a visit to their classroom to teach the children about their 5 rules to keep them safe. They "played" with Pop-its to help them with their math lessons and worked on their gross motor skills. Our Toddler Room received two new students from our infant room and their room is very busy! They made their own paper mittens and one of the mittens was placed in the room somewhere and the students had to find their match. They made their own puffy paint to make their own illustration of "The Snowy Day". They made piano Handprints as keepsakes for their parents and enjoyed their new study of music and movement. Our infant room received two new infants and have been kept very busy getting to know their new students! Thank you Teachers!

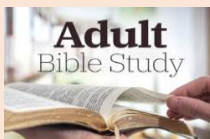
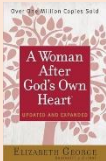
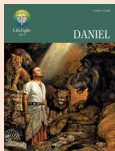
March for Life will be on **Saturday, January 24, 2026 at 11:00 am.**
