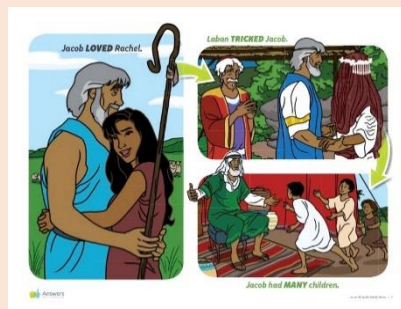
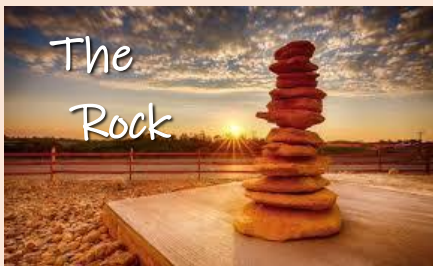
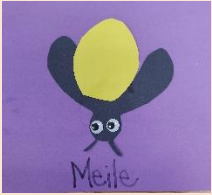
ECDC News

On our way to graduation! Our students are working hard towards graduation. Our four-year olds have finished their alphabet and now will practice writing their letters in preparation for kindergarten. In science they have been learning about the life cycle of acorns and seeds. Exploring how an acorn can develop into a mighty oak tree which then produces more acorns! What a wondrous God we have! They have been learning simple addition using the number 1-5 and studied their daily schedule. They discussed about trying new things, how not to be afraid to do new things and to ask for help if they need it.

The beautiful weather this week was a big draw and they indulged in the opportunity to play outside. Our three-year olds have had a very exciting week with the eggs in their incubator hatching right before their eyes. Three baby chicks are drying out and enjoying the warm environment of the incubator. They also created their own caterpillar after reading author Eric Carle's book "The Hungry Caterpillar", they studied the letter "W" by making Walter the Weasel and made some fireflies after reading the book "The Lonely Firefly" by the same author. Their Bible story was about How Many Times to You Forgive Someone. To celebrate Spring, they created a bluebird and nest from their handprint and strips of brown paper. Outside was a big part of their week as well, summer is coming! GSRP excitement was palatable as they walked to Bridgman Elementary school identifying the house numbers on the way to meet the teachers and tour the school. On the way back from their awesome field trip, they sang the "ABC" song to the delight of homeowners who heard them as they walked. Thank you for showing everyone your learned skills. They also worked on their hallway etiquette, how to stay focused on their goals or instructions with so many distractions in the hallway! They wrote a poem about school. Practicing every aspect of career and work-related avenues to better assess career paths. Our toddler room was busy with outdoor fun every day, except for the rainy ones. They were working on their fine motor skills by stringing beads, making play popsicles with tissue paper and molds, they grouped fruit loops into color groups to make a rainbow and they made bird feeders to watch the birds eat. Their Bible story this week was "God is in Charge of Everything". Our infant room spent a lot of time outside enjoying walks and their play area. Their theme this week was "Outer Space" and they enjoyed reading books about space and the stars, sang songs like "Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star". "The Marion Winter Dedicated Fund for the Performance of Traditional Lutheran Worship Music: The Board of Finance created a new dedicated fund in honor of Marion Winter's 60 years of service to the Lord. A dedicated fund is a fund that is distinct from the budget of the church. A dedicated fund is, as the name implies, dedicated for a particular purpose. This new dedicated fund intends to help Immanuel Lutheran Church supplement its future offerings of traditional Lutheran worship music. Here are a few ideas, concept, and possibilities for which this new fund might be used: (1) to enable a Lutheran school choir to present at Immanuel (e.g., a local Lutheran High School; or a choir from a Concordia University); (2) to afford ILC a special guest organist, and/or organ concert; (3) to allow ILC to invite special musicians/vocalists to supplement the musical offerings Immanuel already is offering (e.g., a guest musician playing the viola, or a brass quartet). This new dedicated fund would not pay for regular maintenance such as the cleaning of the organ/piano/chimes, or the tuning of the organ/piano/chimes. The Board of Worship will steward this new fund and will coordinate with Pastor Kregel to make decisions on specifically what extra music would be provided. The Board of Worship and Pastor Kregel will keep the musical legacy Marion Winter's has provided ILC in mind as specific plans are made. If you would like to contribute to this new dedicated fund then please make your check out to "Immanuel Lutheran Church" and note that it is for "The Marion Winter Dedicated Fund." A donation to this new fund may be done at any time the donor chooses. Thank you for your consideration."
