### **AS WE GATHER**

This morning, we will continue to prepare for Christmas with the help of John the Baptist. John the Baptist was Jesus' relative. The Virgin Mary's relative (Luke 1:36) was Elizabeth. Elizabeth was John the Baptist's mother. While serving in the temple in Jerusalem, John the Baptist's father, a priest named Zechariah, received the good news from the angel Gabriel that they, an elderly couple, would be blessed with a baby boy. While John the Baptist had the right to become a priest, he instead served as the last of a long line of prophets who pointed souls forward to the Savior of the world (Luke 1:76-79). After Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist, and after Jesus recruited his disciples, and began his public ministry, John the Baptist sent his own disciples to discern the truth, that Jesus of Nazareth was the One, the Savior, the Messiah, the Christ. Christmas is the celebration of this same truth that Jesus is God. May the Holy Spirit bless us as we prepare to celebrate the Christmas Gospel that God came in flesh in Jesus for us and for our salvation.

### **ECDC NEWS**

The excitement has been building all week as our students are learning about the birth of Jesus and what Christmas is really all about! They have been practicing their parts and working very hard on practices all week long and doing a marvelous job!

Our Infant room worked on the theme of Holiday, singing Christmas songs and reading some really great books about the birth of Jesus. They continued making wonderful gifts for their parents, all of them wonderful keepsakes. Our lead teacher Erin is very gifted and always does research to find new keepsakes for parents. Their baby sign language word was "Baby".

Our Toddler Room was busy making gifts for their parents, the smart teachers switched the toys out from storage to keep those children busy. They have a large climbing castle in their room and they get to watch birds eat out of the clear bird feeder on their window. They made a felt Christmas tree with felt ornaments that the children can take off and put on the tree wherever they would like. They made a smash painting and made paper Christmas "candies" with dot markers. They also made and enjoyed banana sushi, great creativity teachers!

Our GSRP room worked hard on their gross motor skills this week in the gym because of the weather this week. They learned how their bodies moved, they stomped their feet, they started hopping and they learned how to walk like a crab. They started using jingle bells for their Christmas music which is a precursor to their study of Music next month. They used their fine motor skills to cut out ornaments for their paper Christmas Trees. They created snowballs for their names to get the letters in the correct order. Thank you teachers for your wonderful skills in creative teaching!

Our three year olds were super busy making so many gifts for their parents, we can't share with you what those presents are, but it involved finger prints in colors using patterns to create a great piece of art as a keepsake. They worked on their letter sounds and how to spell their names by building a Christmas Tree with letters. Their Bible story this week was The Birth of Jesus. They finger painted with red and green to see which colors they create.

Our four year olds learned more about the number 6 this week, the letter "K", the color green, and the shape of the star. They practiced creating a pattern out of beads by making candy canes to hang on their Christmas Tree. They have been working really hard on practicing writing their name and making a number book to help them keep their numbers in order.

Miss Shannon along with her assistant teachers will be creating projects and art pieces to help the students learn about the birth of our Lord and Savior.
