### **AS WE GATHER**

October 18 is designated by the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod as the Feast of Saint Luke, Evangelist. Throughout this church year, the Gospel lessons have been from the Gospel of Luke. In the LCMS Lectionary, this last year is referred to a Series C (the last series in a three-year cycle of readings). In addition to being the Gospel the church has been focusing upon throughout the last year, Luke is also worthy of our commemoration as he wrote over one third of the New Testament while traveling with Saint Paul on the second and third missionary journeys. Luke stayed by Paul's side when Paul was imprisoned in Caesarea and again in Rome. In today's epistle lesson, we read the last recorded words of Saint Paul – words which include a reference to Paul's close friend, co-worker in Christ, and fellow evangelist – Luke. May the risen Lord Jesus bring us to enjoy share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with the same vigor as Luke while being a Christian friend like Luke was to Paul.


What is Worship? Gloria in Excelsis: This is one of the very oldest hymns sung by Christians. The earliest reference to it occurs in a letter written in A.D. 112, when Christians were still being ruthlessly persecuted by the Roman Empire. Pliny the Younger, a Roman governor, was writing to the Roman emperor Trajan to seek advice concerning how to conduct the trials of Christians. In this letter, he describes how Christians worship: "On an appointed day they had been accustomed to meet before daybreak, and to recite a hymn antiphonally to Christ, as to a god" While bizarre to a pagan like Pliny, Christians easily recognized this reference to the Gloria: "O Lord, the only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ: O Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father."

#### **ECDC NEWS**

The fall season is in full swing and God has been so good to us with the excellent weather. The students and teachers have been very busy with tree studies and the fall seasons and all that entails.

Our Infant Room studied Fall this week by creating finger play about falling leaves, they sang about Ten Little Leaves to the tune of "Ten Little Indians". They made some percussion instruments out of dried corn and toilet paper rolls enjoying creating the sound. They studied the circle shape and the color green. They made a keepsakes out of their handprints creating an apple shape from their hands. They made an apple out of a handprint and red paint and played with leaves and acorns in their sensory table. Their baby sign language word was "Good Night". What great teachers we have that will go the extra mile to help the infants to communicate.

Our Toddler Room is celebrating and learning from a new teacher this week. We are grateful and blessed to have "Mr. Dom", Dominic Giunta, Tanya Hildebrandt's son and Brad and Debbie Hildebrand's grandson. He has joined our staff and we are so very grateful for our new staff who have come to help us teach these wonderful children entrusted to our center. They focused animals that live in trees, they talked about birds, squirrels and insects that make their home in the trees. They made hedgehogs out of dried leaves, they played with dried leaves, sticks and acorns in their sensory table. They made apple cinnamon play dough and created birds, squirrels and spiders out of the dough. They started decorating for their fall parties with handmade jack-o-lanterns, bats and spiders which they hung in their windows, doors and walls. Their Bible story was about Jonah and the Whale.

Our GSRP room, our Early Learners and Skill Builders enjoyed a wonderful field trip to Stover's Farm where they consumed apple cider, ate apple cider donuts, picked apples from the trees, picked out a pumpkin from the fields and got to go on a fun hayride! What a great way to teach the children about how things grow and when to harvest, other uses for vegetables and just enjoying the gifts God has given to us. The GSRP continued on with their tree study, they practiced their cutting skills with scissors creating colorful leaf pieces out of construction paper. They used paint and stamps to create a beautiful art piece resembling trees. They created charts listing who lives in trees, the children this year are very well informed and came up with so many things that live in trees, they filled their charts.

Our three year olds in the Early Learners room made "Spookly" the square pumpkin, they studied the letter "G" and made Gregory the Goat faces. They painted dotted black bats to fill the dots using their fine motor skills to keep the markers in the dots. Their Bible story was "Noah Builds an Ark". At Stover's farm they watched as an artisan made a spoon out of a gourd and saw other useful items created from pumpkins and gourds. They sent home paper pumpkins to their families to see how they would decorate a pumpkin and then the children brought them back to display them.

Our four year olds in the Skill Builder's room reviewed their numbers 0,1,2,3,and 4, they studied the letter "M", the color black and the oval shape. They colored pictures of Abraham counting the stars in the sky of God's promise to give him a son and many ancestors. They also read the story "Jacob's Troubles". We are blessed and grateful to all of our teachers and staff who work so hard to teach our children about our Lord!













### "The Rock" Sunday School

Today at The Rock, we will learn about Hannah and Samuel. Hannah had always wanted to have a baby, but since she didn't have any children, this made her really sad. Hannah prayed to God and made a special promise: if God gave her a son, she would give him back to God to serve Him. God listened to Hannah's prayers and blessed her with a baby boy named Samuel. When Samuel was just a little boy, Hannah kept her promise. She took him to the tabernacle, a special place of worship, and left him there with a kind man named Eli, so he could help serve God. One night, while Samuel was sleeping, he heard a voice calling his name. He thought it was Eli, but it wasn't! This marked the beginning of Samuel's special journey with God, during which he would grow up to become an important prophet and leader. Hannah's story teaches us about faith and keeping our promises to God.
