A cold week for our students not as much outdoor activities were accomplished. But with Easter one week away, the children were busy learning about Jesus's journey to the cross. Our infants got to work on a new sensory mat and danced to "Shake Your Sillies Out" by the Wiggles. They read the book "Napping House". They crawled through their tunnel and played peek-aboo. 

#### Do You Have Your Palm?

We handed out Palm fronds to you today to remind you of Jesus' triumphant entrance into the city of Jerusalem. If you would like to keep your frond for years to come, folding it into a cross is an ideal way to preserve it. Folding a palm frond into a cross can be a beautiful decoration for Easter, or all year long. Here is how to do it:

**Step 1:** First, hold the palm branch in your hand, pointy side of the frond facing side up.

**Step 2:** Fold the blade at a 90 degree angle, to the right.

**Step 3:** Hold the fold down, you will see it creates a triangle. Now fold that triangle down.

**Step 4:** Fold again. You will now see a small square where the triangle was.

**Step 5:** Push the pointy end around the back of the square where the triangle was.

**Step 6:** Take the pointy end and loop it towards you, then push the pointy end through the square until it comes out the other side.

Step 7: Pull it all the way through.

**Step 8:** Gently tug on both sides until it is locked into position.

**Step 9:** Loop the point end towards yourself, and push through the square.

**Step 10:** You just made the top of the cross.

**Step 11:** Turn your frond 45 degrees so that the pointy end is now facing downward, and the fat end is facing to the right.

**Step 12:** Now flip the frond so that the fat end is now on your left (pointy end is still down)

**Step 13:** Take the fat end of the frond and loop it towards you into the square.

**Step 14:** Pull it until it reaches about the same length as the head you previously made.

**Step 15:** Now, turn your frond over sot that the straight fate end faces left once more.

**Step 16:** Last, take the fat end and loop it towards you back into the square, until it's about the same length as the other two parts. Tuck it into the square – and you're done!

There are many wonderful ways to display your Palm Sunday Cross, what about making an Easter centerpiece with the cross featuring predominantly? Enjoy!
