AS WE GATHER

The Apostle Paul described the duties of the pastor as being a "steward of the mysteries of God. "This title included the task of teaching the Bible as God intended - accurately and in an orthodox manner. Paul also described his service to the Lord as being a "fool for Christ." In addition, Paul described his work as being a father to the church in Corinth. The image of "father" is one also spoken of by Martin Luther in the Large Catechism in the explanation to the Fourth Commandment. Timothy was sent to the church in Corinth as a pastor -Paul sent Timothy to the Corinthians to continue what Paul started, namely, the orthodox teaching of the Bible. Paul also noted that he was dedicated to applying both Law (rod) and Gospel (spirit of gentleness) to the church in Corinth. Paul was prepared to apply the rod to those in the church in Corinth who were arrogant/puffed up - that is they thought they knew better than Paul, Timothy, or the Bible. Paul shared the Gospel as he taught that the church of Corinth was rich in the grace and mercy found in Christ Jesus. As the church and the Office of the Public Ministry were to serve together (like a pair of scissors, two blades, united on pivot point, for the purpose of getting a job done) in Corinth, so the church and the ministry at ILC is to serve in a highly coordinated fashion for the good of the church and for the salvation of many souls.


