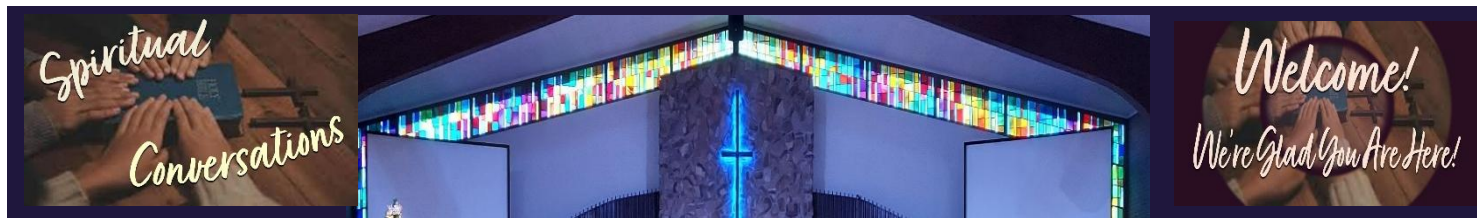

ECDC NEWS

You may have heard some information circulating around about our ECDC Director Barb Ackerman. Barb has recently been diagnosed with Myeloma, also called multiple myeloma, is a cancer of plasma cells (a type of white blood cell) that develop abnormally in the bone marrow. Barb's mother was also diagnosed with myeloma. Barb begins her treatments this Tuesday and we ask that you keep her and her family in your prayers. We know that God is with her and prayer goes a long way to seeing to her comfort and peace during her time of treatment.

Many challenges faced our teachers and students this week. God has gifted us with some wonderful winter weather, but has postponed the learning process for our school. The teachers have tried throughout the roller coaster of attendance and illness to persist in the lesson plans. We are blessed with so many wonderful people who share their love of Christ and children.

Our infant room worked on "In the Kitchen" as a theme this week. They made "music" with kitchen utensils, they pushed grocery carts around and "shopped" for plastic fruits and vegetables. They glued white circles on black paper and played with the new fallen snow in their sensory table inside the classroom. Their Bible story was "God is Good" with Zoe the Zebra puppet telling the story. Their baby sign language this week was "Please" Thank you to our wonderful teachers who bring new and creative ideas to their students.

Our Toddler Room has their lead teacher out sick, but Debbie Zimmerman stepped up to provide wonderful activities for their music and instruments study this month. Debbie brought in a xylophone and zither for the children to play music on and learn how music is made on those instruments. They visited one of our pianos and looked at the insides while it was being played. They blew up balloons and danced to music while playing with the balloon creating a balloon dance. They also filled their sensory bins with snow to make snowmen and snow castles. They made kazoos out of toilet paper tubes, rubber bands and wax paper. Their Bible story was Jesus Comes to Save Sinners".

Our three year olds for the few days they were in the classroom worked on the letter "R", they talked about winter and snow, and what animals live in a winter climate and what they eat. They cut out and glued on rain drops and created clouds out of cotton balls to show rain coming from clouds working on the letter "R". They made Polar Bears out of paper showing what kind of animals live in a winter climate.

Our four year olds practiced their names this week, writing the letters of their name over and over. They worked on their numbers by identifying numbers on their 100 day chart, counting the days they have been in school so far this year. They worked on the sounds of letters and drew some self-portraits. Their Bible story this week was "Joseph and His Brothers". They continued with their investigation unit by looking at dry fall leaves and what uses they might have. God has blessed us with much snow and colder temperatures, but He also gave us a glimpse of Spring a couple of weeks ago, we know it will be soon!

"The Rock" Sunday School

David became king. David loved God and wanted everyone to remember that God was with them. In Jerusalem, David built a palace for himself and made plans to bring the ark of God there. David wanted to build a beautiful house, called a temple, for the ark of God. He told Nathan the prophet about his plan, but God sent a message to David through Nathan. God said David *would not build the temple because he had been a man of war. Instead, God promised that David's son, Solomon, would one day build the temple for God.* God gave David a very special promise, called a covenant. God said that one day a great King would come from David's family. That King was Jesus, who would be the King of kings forever! David was a good king who loved God and wanted to do what was right. He built a palace and had a big family. But even good people can make mistakes. Later, David made a very big mistake and tried to hide it from everyone. Have you ever done something wrong and tried to hide it? That's what David did in this story. Today at The Rock, we are going to find out what happened next from, 2 Samuel 12:1-5.

- Berrien Springs was in midst of their building program

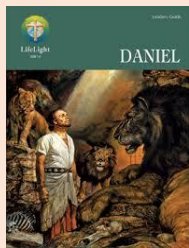
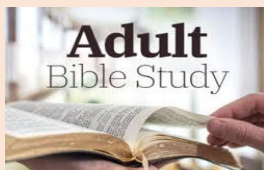
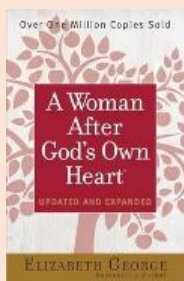
