In no way is our response of faith and life motivated by some form of compulsion. May the Lord send us His Holy Spirit through His Word to create and sustain saving faith in our hearts until that day our faith will give way to sight as we continue to give thanks to God for all eternity in heaven

Service of the Word: We Hear God's Word and Confess Together. Strengthened by the speaking of God's Word, we together, as the Body of Christ, pray the **Prayer of the Church.** We give thanks to God for His gifts, especially the preaching of God's Word. The prayer also ties the worship service to the life of God's people, bringing our petitions before Him for the church, for those in our homes and for the world. Gloria Patri (LSB p. 186): A common refrain used in various parts of the service., it is usually associated with a Psalm. It echoes the words of Baptism in its use of the full Triune name (Matt. 28:19). It glorifies God in echoes of the songs of angels. "Glory to God in the highest" (Luke 2:14). Kyrie (LSB p.186): "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David," the Canaanite woman begs (Matt. 15:22). "Lord, have mercy on my son," pleaded a nameless man for his son (Matt. 17:15). "Lord, have mercy on us, Son of David," cried out two blind beggars (Matt. 20:30). We also cry out in faith for our Lord to grant us mercy and healing.






