
The Service of Sacrament God Comes to Us in the Lord's Supper, and We Testify Together to This Gift

Definition – The Service of the Word revolves around hearing God's Word read and preached. The Service of the Sacrament revolves around receiving God's Word "in, with and under" bread and wine, that is, that is, the Lord's Supper. A Sacrament is a gift from God that combines His Wod with a physical element, in this case bread and wine, and the forgiveness of sins. The Preface - "The Lord be with you. And with Thy Spirit" (2Timothy 4:22) prepares us to eat this feast. The Preface acknowledges the pastor's authority from God to distribute this meal to God's people (1Corinthians 4:1). While the pastor's task is acknowledged, our attention is directed "to things above". The pastor admonishes the people to "lift up your hearts", echoing the words of Lamentations 3:41 and Colossians 3:1-2. We respond, "We lift them up unto the Lord". We then move into the Proper Preface, adding to the daily thanksgiving a seasonal focus. This preface will change accord to the Sunday of the Church Year. The Proper Preface concludes with he words, "with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven." We give thanks and praise therefore, with all the hosts of heaven. And what do these angels and saints who died before us sing? The sing the song of heaven, the "Holy, Holy, Holy" (Isaiah 6:1-7, Revelation 4:1-11). By singing the song of heaven here, we acknowledge God's unique presence in the Sacrament as we approach it with all reverence and fear.

With the excitement of Halloween over, the students are going back to the business of learning. They are all busy working on their Thanksgiving Songs and making decorations for the tables for their famous Thanksgiving Feast coming up on November 25th. They are also practicing for the Children's Christmas Program on December 14th. Whew! Thank you, teachers, for working so hard to teach our students.

Our infant room was busy with studying emotions this week. They explored books about emotions and feelings. They made the color purple by squishing the colors blue and red in a plastic baggie until the colors changed to a cohesive purple. They painted a square picture purple with paint dots. Teacher, Ms. Maegan is proudly showing this art piece. Their Bible story this week was God Made Everything with the puppet Leo the Lion telling the story. They created a puppet play about emotions and practiced their baby sign for the week "Good-Bye".

The Toddler Room was very busy learning about baking Bread. They made mini fruit pizzas and a dough which formed into a kind of churros, which the toddlers totally enjoyed eating. They made leaf garland to decorate their room and water colored a leaf shape to decorate their windows in their room.

They worked on their gross motor skills by throwing pompoms at tape hanging on their walls, trying to get the pompoms to stick to the tape. Their Bible story focused on thankfulness, describing Miriam's thankfulness to God for their seeming escape from Egypt and Pharoah's army. What a great lesson in thankfulness!



Recognizing the danger, Jonathan warned his friend, saying, "You need to be careful; my father is very upset." To protect David, they created a secret signal with arrows: if Jonathan shot an arrow far into the field and called out, it meant David should flee to safety. Despite Saul's pursuit, God protected David and his men. Although David had chances to harm Saul, he chose to trust God and wait for the right time to receive the kingdom. One day, Jonathan shot an arrow deep into the distance and shouted, "The arrows are beyond you!" David understood it was time to leave for his safety. 




