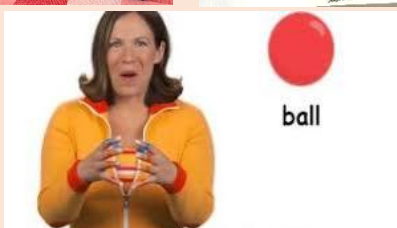

ECDC NEWS

Our rooms were back to business this week. The School Age Room enjoyed a Sports Theme this week. They made foam fingers to wave at their games, they competed in relay and foot races and their friends rooted them on with the foam fingers they made. They designed and created their own team jerseys, first designing them on paper and then creating them on T-shirts. On the really hot days, they enjoyed their slip and slide and their splash pad. On the really, really hot days, they stayed inside and put together jigsaw puzzles. On Friday they got to go on another field trip to "Power In Motion", where they learned some new tumbling and acrobatic moves, played on trampolines and gymnastic equipment and generally enjoyed movement.

Our Primary room tried to keep cool too by enjoying water tables, making and sailing sponge sailboats in the water tables, watching to see how long their sponge boats would float for. They made robots out of toilet paper rolls, and decorated crosses with cut up construction paper. With the warm weather this week, they spent the hot days in the gym playing in the cool large space. We are very grateful we have that cool place to play. Our children here have very active agile minds and keeping them busy can be a monumental job. Our teachers spend many hours looking for projects to keep the children busy and help them to not get bored. We are so very blessed to have the staff we have, who continue to keep our children safe, happy and secure.

Our toddler room enjoyed more of their water study. They made pretty little goldfish out of their handprints, making it look like a goldfish in a bag of water, what a great keepsake for their families. They talked about what animals live in water, what they eat, how they rest, and what makes them prey for other animals. They painted with spray bottles, taking paint and putting it into spray bottles making some really great art pieces. They went to Starbuck's Blueberry Farm to pick some blueberries for their family and to eat here as a snack. They watched as blue water dropped from an eye dropper spread out into clear water, great experiment! They also played with watercolor, coloring a black and white line drawing print by applying water onto dried colors and creating their own colors of paint.

Our infant room studied bubbles and balls this week. Their baby sign language word this week was "Ball" along with songs they sang like "Roll, Roll, Roll the Ball" and read books like "The Friendship Ball". They worked on rolling the ball to their teachers and putting a ball in a basket, all great gross motor skill exercises. They painted with bubble wrap and got to walk bare foot over bubble wrap. Their Bible story this week was "God Is Good" with Zoe the Zebra puppet helping to tell the story.

Planning Committee Update: A diverse group of Immanuel members—the Planning Committee—was formed to reflect on the insights gathered from last fall's Congregational Planning Retreat and the recent reconciler report. This committee has met twice since the May Voter's meeting. The feedback confirmed what many of us already knew: the members of Immanuel are deeply committed to living out their faith by sharing the love of Christ and serving both the congregation and the broader community. At the same time, it became evident that our current governance structure, originally designed for a larger congregation, no longer supports our ministry effectively. Rather than enabling our mission, it has often become a barrier. In response, the Planning Committee has been actively exploring governance models that are better suited to the size and needs of our congregation. Our goal is to develop a right-sized structure that empowers the congregation to grow and thrive in Christ—now and into the future. A key aspect of the models under consideration is a streamlined core governance framework, complemented by the flexibility to form additional committees as needs arise. We seek a model that not only reflects our current identity but also enhances our capacity to faithfully carry out our mission in the years to come. Transparency remains a priority. We are committed to keeping the congregation informed and engaged throughout this process, and you can expect regular updates like this one in the church bulletin. Looking ahead, we plan to bring forward recommendations for a right-sized governance model at the 2025 Congregational Planning Retreat (CPR), which we hope Pastor Johnson will facilitate. This retreat will provide a dedicated space for listening to congregants' thoughts and concerns—particularly those related to governance. As we continue this important work, your prayers, questions, and voices are not only welcome—they're essential.

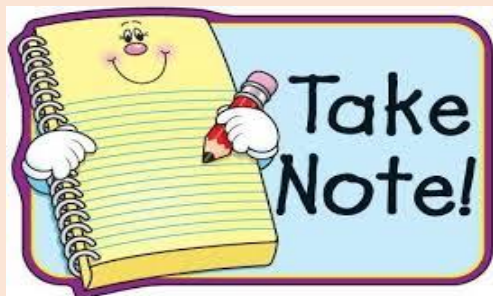

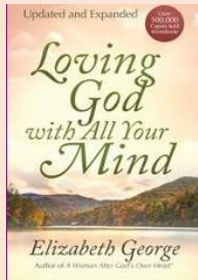
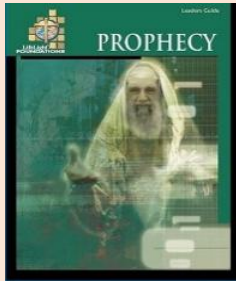
